1. CD-ROM with statewide coverage. Over 34,000 listings for the entire state of California are contained on one disk. A single-user disk costs \$129. Call 800-440-4780 for pricing if you need more than ten CDs.

2. Addiction Recovery Guide. This 200-page print guide contains 2,700 listings of Southern California programs for treatment, sober living, child and adolescent programs, co-occurring disorders, DUI, eating disorders, education and prevention, gambling, professional certification, recovery and support, sexual addictions, and smoking. This is a free publication; the only cost is the shipping fee of \$5.

3. Neighboring county guides. The 840-page Los Angeles/Ventura guide contains over 10,500 listings in 57 categories, and the 445-page Orange County guide contains over 5,200 listings in 55 categories.

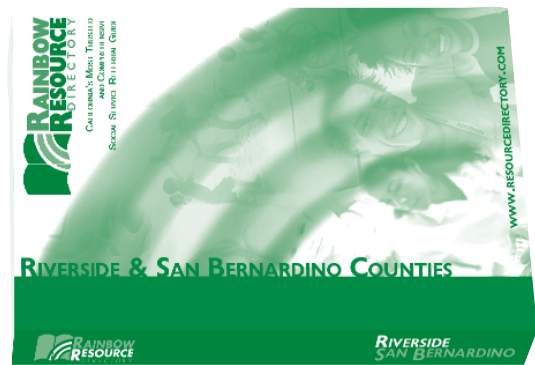
